"If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all."

Sounds so simple, doesn't it? Paul, in his letter to the church at Rome makes it appear to be so very easy. And it is...until, of course, you try to actually do it.

Looking at the news headlines on any given day reveals that we are not very good at doing this hard stuff of the Christian Way. It's so much easier to give in to the impulses of our lizard brains that are constantly reacting out of instinct instead of responding out of gracious understanding. Read the headlines again, and you will see that we still find it easier to hurl juvenile insults, degrade one another's humanity, or pull the trigger than to live peaceably with all. Paul would be disappointed. But I think he would understand.

We are just so very human, aren't we? Jesus, however, calls us to do the super-human thing, the beyond-our-lizard-brain thing:

- turn the other cheek
- love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you
- do not judge, so that you may not be judged

We often forget these instructions of Jesus, especially when we ourselves are wounded. But only those who have been wounded have the capacity to understand what it means to wound another person. Embracing the Spirit-with-us gives us the wisdom and ability to refrain from adding yet more woundedness to the world.

Thomas a Kempis wrote:

"Don't be angry that you cannot make others as you wish them to be, since you cannot make yourself as you wish to be."

Like Paul, Thomas puts the first focus on us, on what we can do to better ourselves for the sake of the world. May we be blessed to continue in the recognition of the Spirit that comes at Pentecost that enables us to do the hard stuff, and which, in turn, spreads the peace of God and the unity of God's children to even the darkest places.
