Matthew 7:12 reminds us of what many call the Golden Rule: "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you, for this is the Law and the Prophets." Jesus could not have been clearer about how we are called to treat those around us - with the same dignity and care we would hope to receive ourselves.

Over the past two weekends, FCC has been living out this teaching in powerful ways. On September 7, forty-six people came together to pack hygiene bags for our neighbors in need. These were gratefully

received by Shower-Up, a ministry working with Manna House to provide safe and clean mobile showering facilities for those experiencing homelessness. Then, this past Saturday, a group from FCC traveled to Manna House to serve a hot meal, organize a clothing closet, and share communion with those who gathered for worship on the loading dock of the food distribution warehouse. This time of service and worship was not only meaningful for those receiving care, but also deeply enriching for those who came to give of their time and compassion. These two events are just the begin-



ning. They are a glimpse of the love and care that can ripple outward long after our Love Thy Neighbor Campaign ends.

I invite you to discover a cause that stirs your heart - jump in, serve, and share. When we serve those around us, we are serving God. Let us go forth and spread the hope of God to everyone we meet.

BEYOND BROKENNESS — BUILDING BELOVED COMMUNITY

"If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ... We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God." – 2 Corinthians 5:17-20, NIV

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 5 are nothing short of revolutionary. He invites us to see the world no longer "from a human point of view," but through the lens of God's new creation. In Christ, the old order—built on rivalry, suspicion, and estrangement— has been decisively overturned. God's reconciling work is about transforming the way we live together here and now. To belong to Christ is to belong to this ministry—a vocation in which our every word, every action, is shaped by the message that God has already made peace with the world through Jesus. And because God has entrusted to us this ministry of reconciliation, the Church becomes the main organization of God's new creation in a fragmented world.

The annual Reconciliation Ministry Special Offering will be received on September 28th and October 5th (in solidarity with World Communion Sunday). Half of your gift remains with the Alabama-Northwest Florida Region.
