Being Evangelism - A New Approach

It is my hope to make a transformative change in the way we here at First Christian "do" evangelism. Let's be honest: the old ways don't work anymore. Revivals, cold calls and knocking on doors, handing out brochures, or even fast and furious responses to worship guests are not only ineffective but often turn people off.

So. What works? When you look at Scripture, and in particular the way Jesus connects with people in the Gospel stories, it all comes down to one word: relationships. We must begin, not with a program and not with assigning the work of evangelism to a small group of people, but with melding into the culture of our congregation an emphasis on one of the most natural actions and most basic needs of our human creation: building relationships.

To that end, I want to share an idea that, actually, has been around for a while. It's called Relational Evangelism, and it's exactly what it sounds like: connecting people with the life of the church through connecting with people through personal relationships. I want to share with you nine principles of Relational Evangelism, briefly here, but I will expand and explain them in upcoming issues of the Journey:

- 1. Focus on Building Deep Friendships
- 2.Be the Kind of Christian Unchurched People Have Never Met Before
- 3.Cross-pollinate Your Unchurched Friends with your Fellow Group Members
- 4. Avoid Duplicity

5. Give and Take Refrigerator Rights with

Unchurched Friends

6.Pray for Yourself

7. Refuse to Engage in Gossip

8. Share a Relevant Message

9.Invite, Invite, Invite!

(These nine principles are from Randall Neighbour, President of TOUCH Outreach Ministries.)

As I said, I will expand on these in the coming weeks. In the meantime, let me end with this brief word: one of my mentors once wrote, "Stop praying. Be prayer." It got my attention, and I hope it gets yours.

Think about it. Stop doing and be whatever it is that you think is most important. In that vein, I will say, stop doing evangelism and be the messengers of good relationships that lead to good church connections.


