CHRISTIAN CHURCH (DISCIPLES OF CHRIST) BEGINNINGS

Everything has a starting point, and the denomination of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is no different. In the 1800s, two religious movements converged to create what is known as the Stone-Campbell Movement, which eventually separated into the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), the United Church of Christ, and the Church of Christ. However, a document written in 1804 began the Stone movement and still helps steer the identity and practices of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) denomination.

Barton Stone had been working (and getting into trouble) as a Presbyterian minister in Springfield, Kentucky. Over time, he began to take issue with some key aspects of Presbyterian theology - predestination, in particular. Eventually, things came to a head, and a landmark document was produced. The Last Will and Testament of the Springfield Presbytery was penned in 1804. Although the congregation was strong and growing, those who attended and led this presbytery signed away the life of the congregation as it was known.

The document begins with a brief summary of the congregation's health and an acknowledgment of the document's intended purpose. It states, "We will, that this body die, be dissolved, and sink into union with the Body of Christ at large; for there is but one body, and one spirit, even as we are called in one hope of our calling." This statement alone was revolutionary at the time.

The document goes on to outline many principles that the Presbytery "willed." Some of the most recognizable today include: congregations having the power over decision-making and the ability to call their own leadership; the Bible as the main source of teaching material; maintaining civility in times of dispute; and placing Jesus at the center of belief (instead of earthly leaders, such as the Pope or bishops).

I invite you to take the time to read this document in full. It is not very long, but it remains a fascinating part of our history!
