#### **SOUPER BOWL OF CARING**

On February 2nd, the eyes of the world will be on Super Bowl LIV as the San Francisco 49ers play the Kansas City Chiefs for the Lombardi Trophy. I will admit that I will be watching the game with my family and our youth group and that I will be cheering for the Chiefs, remember that Patti was raised in Kansas and is very excited by their Super Bowl appearance. It should be a wonderful game, but to me this will not be the highlight of the day.

The highlight of my day will be after the second service when the Youth Group holds its annual Chili Cook

Off and Souper Bowl of Caring fundraiser. I love chili, and if I do say so myself I can cook a mean bowl of red. The competition is always fun and I am looking forward to the Chili Cook Off trophy once again taking its rightful place in my office, but that is not what the day is all about. This day is about caring for those in need, as all of the funds donated to the Chili Cook Off will be donated to the Rose of Sharon Soup Kitchen. Caring for many years, but even I did not know that the Souper Bowl of Caring is celebrating its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year.



The Souper Bowl of Caring is a youth-inspired, youth-led movement working with other groups across the nation including: schools, churches, local businesses, corporations, passionate individuals and NFL teams to tackle hunger in their local communities during the weeks leading up to the biggest celebration in football, the Super Bowl. In 1990, a simple prayer: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup

to eat" was delivered to a small youth group at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC led by Brad Smith, who was serving as a seminary intern at the time.

This gave birth to an idea. Why not harness the energy and enthusiasm of Super Bowl weekend, a time when people come together for football, food and fun, to unite the nation for a higher good? Youth groups could collect money and canned food for those in need and send every dollar and food donation to a local charity of their choice. The first year, they invited 22 area churches to join the team and collected \$5,700 with 100% of donations distributed to local-area charities.

Since then, the Souper Bowl of Caring has become a national, grass roots, youth-led movement where ordinary young people are doing extraordinary work. Over 150 million dollars and food donations have been generated while benefiting thousands of soup kitchens, food banks, meal programs and other hunger-relief Souper Bowl continued next page...
